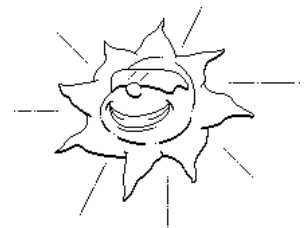
Just a Reminder.....We have a Postal Drop Box available once again here at Southlake Village. It is located on the outside of the Clubhouse right next to the doors.

- No animals (four-legged).

- Do not play with life-saving equipment.
- Guests must be accompanied by resident of Southlake Village.

There is a limit of two guests per resident. If you have more, please check with the office prior to use.

A Few Words on The Parking Lot...

Due to the large number of vehicles here at Southlake Village, we need your help in freeing up some parking spaces. If you own a vehicle that does not run or does not get driven often, we are asking that you move that vehicle off the premises to make room for those vehicles that do. Vehicles that have not moved in over 2 weeks will be tagged and towed at the owners expense. We also will begin towing and disposing of old trailers parked just south of the Clubhouse. If you own one, please claim and remove as soon as possible as we intend on towing within the next 2 weeks!

When parking directly in front of the buildings, please do not pull in so far that the front of your vehicle protrudes over the sidewalk. And be sure to remind your guests that the carports are RESERVED for tenants that have a carport lease only and are not to be parked in.

Parents: You must watch your children, especially when they are riding their bicycles in the parking lot and basketball court. We have had many reports of children riding in between parked cars and crossing the lot with no warning. This is very dangerous and could easily result in an accident or injury.
